It's Merit Mark Time!

When you contribute your time and effort to your squadron, you're eligible to earn a Merit Mark. This means that when you actively serve on a committee, teach a course, organize or run a squadron event, or perform other significant service to the Squadron, Cdr Robyn Levene, AP will recommend you to the USPS Chief Commander for a Merit Mark.

A Merit Mark is a coveted award; it is largely the only official recognition members receive for their efforts. Only one merit mark may be awarded in a year to a member, no matter how

extensive the contribution, and when squadron members earn twenty-five Merit Marks, they become *Life Members* and they are no longer required to pay dues! Our squadron has eight Life Members: Harry Harvey, Leon Dershem, George Tyler, Allen Buskirk, Phillip Faustman, James Bobb, Bob Boyce, and Dan Chappell.

By 15 November 2006, a squadron commander must submit our squadron's recommendations. Therefore, it is time for all KSPS squadron officers to submit your recommendations to Cdr Levene so KSPS and USPS can recognize our generous and unselfish members.

SEO Update

Your SEO has conferred with a number of class chairs about our course with an objective on systemizing our course offerings. An emerging consensus is a minimum class size of 4 to 5. Expecting instructors to teach less than this number may be asking too much. Independent study may be a viable option if there is not enough interest for a formal class.

Another concern is offering too many classes at once. This puts a strain on our educational resources, instructors and participants. Finally, we need to promote courses both from the top down (through the Pilot and announcements at meetings) and bottom up (class chairs and bridge officers making personal calls to prospective candidates.) To do this we need an easily accessible database of members showing the courses they have taken, which have been requested.

Boarding will begin at 0900 at Bishop Park in Wyandotte. The cruise will run from 1000-



1400 with lunch provided onboard. Estimated arrival back at the dock will be 1400.

For anyone who will be joining us, there are a few items you might want to consider bringing: lawn or bag chair, binoculars, sunscreen and/or hat and coat depending on the weather, handheld GPS and any special beverages you might wish to consume; coffee, water and lemonade will be provided.

StarCalc: An E-Star Finder

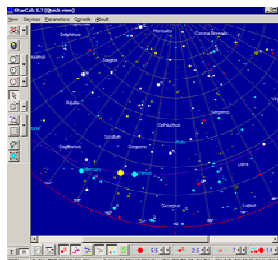
Lt/C Robert B. Small, AP from the Jacksonville (Florida) Sail and Power Squadron located StarCalc, a computer program that will bring a planetarium onto your computer monitor. The program is a creation of Alexander E. Zavalishin. StarCalc shows a picture of the sky at any time of the day or night from any location in the world at any time, and provides an alternative to the "Star Finder" plastic circular slide rule used in the JN and N courses.

Stf/C Robert Landeros, SN used StarCalc when he took his JN and N sights. He found it very helpful to have a printed image of the sky with a clear diagram of the celestial targets of op-

portunity. You can download StarCalc, at no cost at <http://www.relex.ru/~zalex/main.htm>

While not necessary, StarCalc will be helpful for all of you planning to tackle the new *Junior Navigation* course.

Stf/C Landeros will offer the new JN course. It starts on Monday, 23 October 2006, and runs for 10-12 weeks. It will be held at I.H.S. Distributing, 1800 Douglas Avenues, Kalamazoo, Michigan.

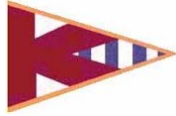

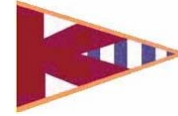

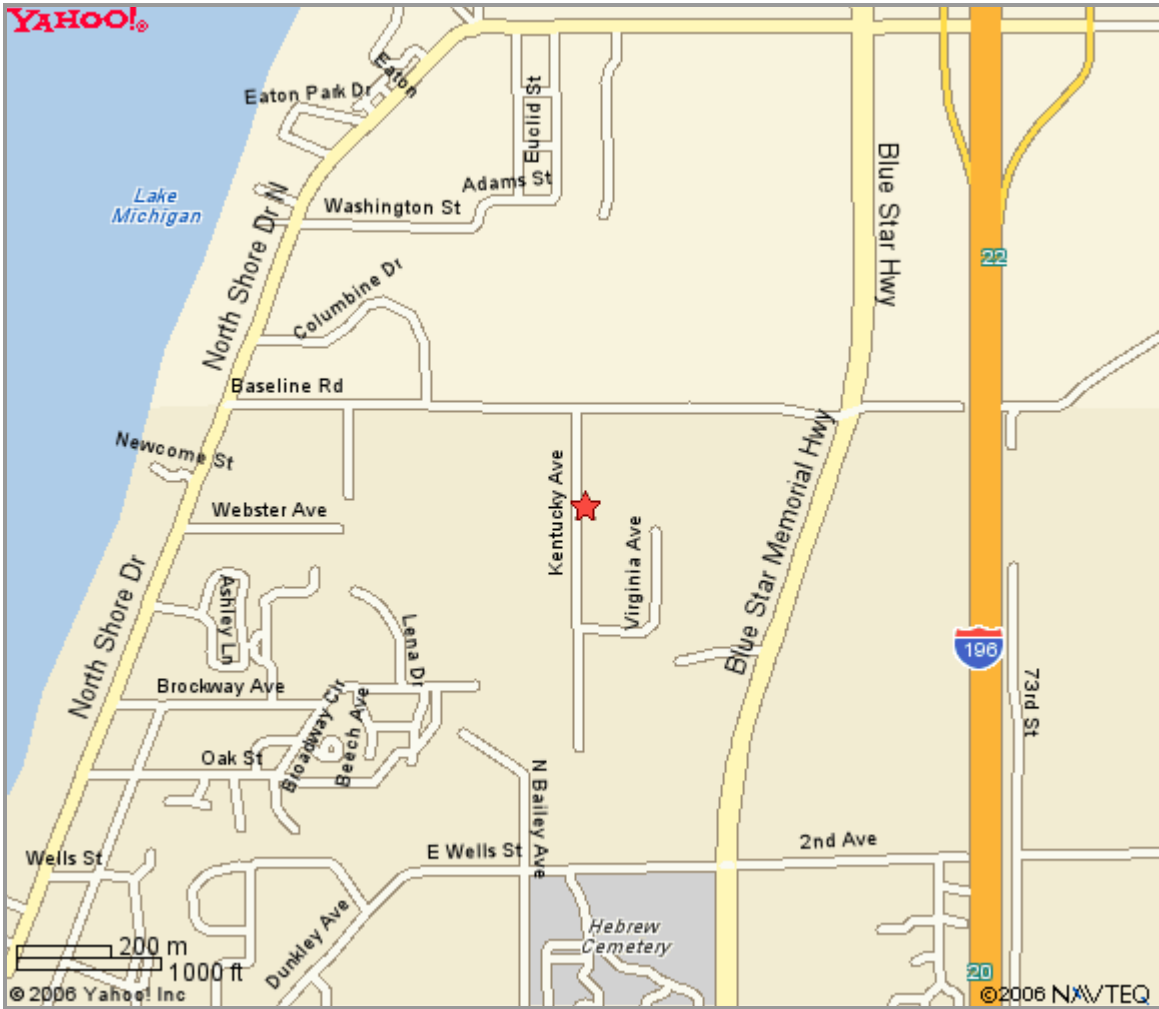
