



June 1 marked the start of the 2007-2008 dues year; to the many Kalamazoo Sail and Power Squadron members who have renewed their membership, a personal thank you for your continued support of our squadron and the United States Power Squadrons. If you have not renewed as yet, I hope you will renew and continue your membership. We need your support so both KSPS and USPS can

together continue the education and other programs needed to ensure safe recreational boating. USPS has added a secure area on their website to enable online dues renewal.

You probably noticed when you were completing your renewal that not all your membership dues go to KSPS. Approximately 43% of your dues payment goes to Kalamazoo, the remainder going to National, District 9 and the USPS Education Fund. Monies from renewals make up about 65% of our operating income, the remainder coming from new memberships, interest income, miscellaneous income and the 50-50 drawings. With declining membership over the past several years, the monies from renewals and new memberships has fallen off. Our operating expenses have also declined, but not to the same degree.



FRATERNAL BOATING CLUB

To forestall a dues increase and maintain stable funding in two of the three sides of the USPS triangle - education and civil service - the Budget Committee has tended to reduce or leave flat the budget for activities associated with the fraternal side of the triangle. Activities such as the District Conference Hospitality Room and Commander's Ball have not been budgeted to cover the steadily rising costs of these events.

The squadron has been able to continue to host a District Confer-

ence Hospitality Room at the same budget amount for the past several years by sharing the room and associated costs with two other squadrons and also through the generous donations of food and beverages supplied by our members. The Commander's Ball continues as the squadron's yearly gala fraternal event, but without the amount of funding that was provided by the squadron in past years. A large portion of the Commander's Ball expenses not covered by the meal price is now being assumed by the commanders directly. Because of the generous donations from the commanders, the KSPS Commander's Ball remains a memorable event.

Although the education side of the USPS triangle has not been as financially affected by our declining income as the fraternal side, the KSPS general operating budget cannot support the purchasing of modern educational tools such as laptops and projectors needed for classroom PowerPoint presentations. The PowerPoint equipment owned by the squadron was purchased with monies from the Acheson Foundation, from member donations, from the estate of former member Donald Warren and memorial donations for former member Maynard Mar-

tin. Our general operating budget cannot fully or even partially fund the sending of our Education Officer or instructors to district or national boating education seminars. To attend these seminars our members must fully fund all expenses out of their own pockets.

Though our squadron is making a substantial effort to increase our membership and reduce the number of non-renewals, we need to look seriously at other means to continue the nearly sixty year KSPS tradition of safe boating based on the USPS triangle of education, civic service and fraternity. KSPS must follow the lead of National and establish its own endowment fund. This fund would be developed and grown over future years from charitable gifts from its members and supporters and only the interest would be used for KSPS programs. Charitable gifts would not only be through outright giving, but also from creative gifts, a gift normally given through a legal instrument or contract.

National has named the endowment fund *The Century Fund* in recognition of USPS' centenary in eight years. We should seriously consider the establishment of a *Diamond Fund* in recognition of KSPS' sixtieth year in 2008.

Brief Rules: more detailed rules given out day of event at mandatory 10 am briefing.

- 1. Speed is not part of the event. Winner will be determined by best 5 card hand, randomly received.
- 2. Participants must adhere to speed limits, especially in congested areas and no wake zones.
- 3. All passengers on participating poker-run dinghies must wear personal floatation devices.
- 4. Absolutely no alcoholic beverages during the Poker Run.
- 5. Written instructions/charts handed out by organizers with appropriate speed and safety notations.
- 6. Event start up will be divided into groups based on speed, with slowest dinghies departing first.
- 7. No departures before assigned start time.
- 8. Rafting may be necessary at final destination, please have 2 dock lines (1 fore and 1 aft)
- 9. Maps and GPS coordinates for the card pick-up locations will be provided at the 10 am briefing.
- 10. Each dinghy shall carry a cell phone, VHF radio or other device for communication.

 Committee will monitor VHF channel _____ for emergencies or assistance. Cell # _____

Failure to obey speed limits, event rules and/or proper boating etiquette will result in disqualification.

KSPS recommends a minimum of two crew, one to operate dinghy, one to read map, navigate, retrieve cards and help keep your dinghy from colliding with docks or other boats. Unless your dinghy is an inflatable, please have bumpers handy for tight quarters and rafting.

Event will be run rain or shine, with the exception of severe weather, like lightning or tornado watch. Storm date: If there is lightning or tornado on 25 August, the event will be rescheduled for 26 August.

Trailering your dinghy? Put in at the public ramp. We're trying to get the usual \$7 fee waived for event.
