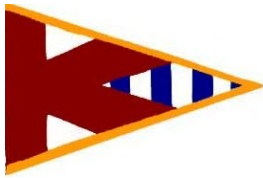

Virtual Vessel Safety Test a Must for All Boaters

Here is a quick review of some of the material covered in the virtual vessel safety check.

- Type of boat
- The boat's method of propulsion including paddle craft and sail
- Length of boat and its requirements
- Operating a boat at night
- Proper placement of hull identification numbers
- Required safety equipment for boat length
- Proper ventilation requirements for engine spaces and other enclosed fuel systems
- Required sound producing devices for boat length
- Requirements for marine sanitation devices
- Electrical systems
- Fuel tanks
- An equipment check list that exceeds federal requirements

What impressed me about the virtual test: it brings to mind just how involved operating a boat can be, yet simple if boaters are informed and educated.

Virtual Vessel Examiner

In a joint website accord, the United States Power Squadron and Coast Guard Auxiliary now offer boaters a wonderful opportunity to be tested by a Virtual Vessel Examiner to determine if their boats are up to speed regarding federal safety requirements. All that is required is a computer and internet connection.

The test covers the full range of boats including sailboats with and without auxiliary engines. It even tests requirements for paddle craft. What I find appealing: the virtual test provides boaters the opportunity to be prepared for an on-site vessel safety check, whether it be conducted by the Power Squadron or Coast Guard Auxiliary.

As a former Coast Guard boarding officer who has inspected hundreds of boats, I often sensed that boaters carry safety equipment in order to meet federal requirements rather than appreciating the inherent value of the equipment. And many fail to understand its proper use. I urge all boaters to take the virtual vessel safety test. Then urge them to follow up the test with an inspection by a certified Vessel Examiner VE either a member of the Coast Guard Auxiliary or United States Power Squadron.

Many of these volunteer lifesavers have owned and operated recreational boats for years, which affords them the opportunity to pass along valuable boating tips. The VE can help explain the purpose of equipment the boat owner has never used plus tell them about classes. When boaters pass an inspection, they will be awarded a Vessel Examination Decal they may post on their vessel. The decal will put them in good standings with the Coast Guard.

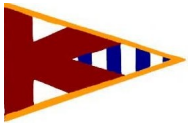
KSPS Recognition
