

2013 and my second year as Commander are coming to their ends. Many thanks to all the squadron members who made this year a success. We had 21 members earn a merit mark this year. That's almost a third of our 70 members, who volunteered above and beyond expectations to earn their merit mark. Some of our members live more than 25 miles from where we hold meetings and classes in Battle Creek and Kalamazoo or events in South Haven, and a few are snow birds who winter down south or are "live-aboards" who are gone all summer. Considering those obstacles, we have a pretty active squadron.

We had 21 students pass America's Boating Course and a dozen teens pass our Youth Boating Safety class. We are hoping for equally large classes this spring. We offered: the 9 week Weather (WX) and Engine Maintenance (EM) courses, one seminar on Sail Trim and one on Sextants. We had a dozen recertify to be instructors. We picked up four new members from USPS cyber space and one from a local ABC class and one who wanted to become a Vessel Examiner.

At the Portage Family Fish Fair, we did community outreach with safety tips for parents and children on how to properly fit a life jacket and lead a hands-on exercise in how to reach or throw, rather than go in the water to rescue a person.

Our seven Vessel Examiners performed 71 boat inspections. We added one new VE and recertified a former VE.

We had seven meetings with a presentation including: Alaska by Sea, Diving for Ship Wrecks, the Stars of Saugatuck, South Haven's Friends of Goodwill, Retrieval and Restoration of a WWII bomber, the squadron trip on the Northern Michigan Inland Waterway and a year ago - "2012: a Year-in-Review".

Please come to the Change of Watch on 14 January to help us celebrate the accomplishments of 2013 and look forward to 2014 with the election of our officers. Come honor those who have volunteered their time to make the Kalamazoo Sail and Power Squadron a source of boating knowledge and boating friendships.

I want to welcome incoming Administrative Officer E-J Ohler to the Bridge. Wally Corder is returning as Squadron Educational Officer, as is Diane Hansen, the Assistant SEO, Nils Strand will continue as Treasurer, and Karen Strand will serve another year as Secretary.

New to the Executive Committee is Jim White. Returning ExCom members are George Gerpheide, Harold Hladky, Gary Bleyer and George Tyler. Mike Galbreath will move from ExCom to Auditing, where he will join Gail Hladkly and Judy Dorais. Returning on the Rules Committee are our two George's and Phyllis Buskirk.
