Metro is Distributing 500,000 Masks to their Riders

Metro has received 500,000 masks from the U.S. Department of Transportation. As they continue efforts to keep riders safe, and to return to normal schedules, they will be providing these masks in hopes that people will self-police themselves and comply with the mayor's orders.

Back in May Metro started requiring masks, however this requirement has not been strictly enforced. While most people are complying, the agency is hesitant to get into confrontations with riders who do not want to wear a mask. So far there has not been any issues and Metro hopes to get things running as close to normal and as soon as possible the best way they can under the current circumstances.

Metro isn't the first transit agency to provide masks. Montgomery County's Ride On has been providing masks to their riders. Some argue, however, that masks should only be provided if the expectation is that riders should wear them.

The Department of Transportation has provided about 10 million masks to transit agencies across the country at no cost. They are working to help protect people and boost public confidence in our transportation systems.

How to Reduce Screen Time While Working from Home

Prior to the pandemic many people may have felt like they already spent a lot of time working in front of their computer. These may have gone away, and people find that they are experiencing screen time fatigue.

Here are a couple of ways to reduce your screen time if you are working from home:

- 1. Do not assume you have to video chat. While Zoom or other similar platforms are great ways for us to stay in touch at work, do not use them as your default. Ask yourself, is this something that can be accomplished by picking up the phone and calling someone or by using email or a task management system?
- 2. Limit your meeting time. Block out times that you are simply not available for meetings if they are particularly draining to you. Also, limit the number of minutes in a meeting. Does a meeting really need to be an hour and a half or longer?
- Choose physical things versus digital. Is there a book you need to read that you can get an actual copy versus reading it digitally? Choose to write your thoughts on paper during brainstorming versus typing online.
- 4. Move around as much as possible.
 Take breaks between meetings to get up from the computer. Walk to your kitchen to refill your coffee. You can even do simple movements such as rolling your shoulders to increase blood circulation.
