New No Right Turn on Red Signs in DC

"No right turn on red" signs have gone up in many new D.C. locations this month and will continue to be installed in the district over the next couple of months.



The District Department of Transportation is banning right turns on red at about 100 new intersections throughout the city. All new signs will be installed by the end of July as an effort to help eliminate traffic deaths and serious injuries in DC by 2024. This is a part of Mayor Bowser's Vision Zero Initiative that was launched back in 2016.

According to DDOT Director Jeff Marootian, the district has taken a number of initiatives to help make intersections safer, including the banning of right turns on red at various locations. In addition, the district has also considered public comment in helping identify areas where similar installations are needed. Also, the public's comment has been instrumental in identifying areas where crosswalks may be needed or additional signage can help clarify the components of an intersection.

The signs are planned to be installed quickly and will not go up in any particular order. Many intersections will receive more than one sign to ensure enough drivers understand what to do.

The first 25 locations where signs will be added are:
