What are some of Washington's Worst Intersections?

Drivers know that there is an increased risk when you approach any intersection. If you are driving in DC this risk can be even more challenging due to traffic and the sometimes challenging logistics of navigating through the area. Recently, the Washington Examiner investigated local police departments' lists of intersections having the most crashes in their jurisdictions. Some argue against comparing jurisdictions, because of the varying ways each one collects and records crash data differently. However, the data still serve as a reminder of the importance of being alert as you come close to intersections.



Here is list of some of DC's worst intersections from April 2012-April 2013:

- New York Ave. and Florida Ave. Northeast
- Pennsylvania Ave. and Anacostia Freeway Southeast
- 3rd Street Tunnel
- Dupont Circle
- North Capitol St. and New York Ave Northeast
- Interstate 295 and Suitland Parkway exit
- K St. and 14th St. Northwest

- M St. and Wisconsin Ave. Northwest
- New Jersey Ave. and New York Ave. Northwest
- U St. and 14th St. Northwest
- Florida Ave. and Georgia Ave. Northwest
- Bladensburg Ave. and New York Ave. Northeast
- North Capitol St. and Jefferson St. Northeast

Experts say that many incidents result from driver errors, such as failure to pay attention, driving too fast, or driving under the influence. However, may of the intersections are simply poorly designed. Area officials frequently review accident reports to identify road flaws that can contribute to crashes. If they find a compromising intersection they look for ways to make it safer. Even with these practices there are simply some areas where not much can be done. Some intersections were built many years ago when design standards and cars were very different. Today, development around those roads makes expanding or reworking some intersections difficult. The best thing you can do is be aware of these challenging intersections and make sure you are driving defensively.
