Distracted Driving While Wearing Headphones and Earbuds

The fact is that wearing earbuds or headphones while driving could increase your distraction level, potentially creating additional dangers on the roadways. In addition, distracted hearing could impair your level of concentration and stop you from hearing the sirens of approaching emergency vehicles, and background noise like horns or railroad warnings, putting you and others at risk.

Va. Code § 46.2-1078 provides that, "[t]t shall be unlawful for any person to operate a motor vehicle, bicycle, electric personal assistive mobility device, electric powerassisted bicycle, or moped on the highways in the Commonwealth while using earphones on or in both ears." [2] The statute defines "earphones" as "any device worn on or in both ears that converts electrical energy to sound waves or which impairs or hinders the person's ability to hear." The ban applies only to earphones used in both ears. Drivers in Virginia can use an earbud, headphone, or Bluetooth device in one ear only. There are several exemptions to this statute.

Drivers must understand that the choice to use headphones or earbuds while driving can create a hazard. It only takes an instant of distraction to cause a serious accident. Drivers should try to eliminate as many distractions as possible while operating a vehicle.
