Dangers of Excessive Speeding and Reckless Driving in 15-Passenger Vans

Recently we received the following complaint from a motorist concerning one of our vans:

"This morning I was forced up on to the curb by one of your vans. It was approximately 6:40 a.m. ... when the van was in the left lane, passed me then decided they did not want to make the mandatory left turn.... After the intersection, the van then got in the left lane and passed the Explorer in front of me. The van then cut off the Explorer when the van did not want to make the mandatory left turn..."



This is in addition to an increase amount of calls we are receiving from motorist complaining about K&K vans either speeding excessively or driving aggressively. We want to remind everyone of the dangers of these types of driving behaviors in 15passenger vans. According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA): "15-passenger vans are not like smaller passenger vans and minivans and have a higher rate of rollover under certain conditions." In addition, "This increased risk occurs because the passenger weight raises the vehicle's center of gravity and causes it to shift rearward. As a result, the van has less resistance to rollover and handles differently from other commonly driven passenger vehicles, making it more difficult to control in an emergency situation. NHTSA has found that more than 90 percent of rollovers occur after a driver has lost control of the vehicle

and has run off the road. One major situation that can lead to a roll over is speeding. While speeding the driver can lose control causing the van to slide sideways off the road. The grassy or dirt medians that line highways can often cause the van to overturn when the tires dig into the dirt. Also, when a driver overcorrects the steering as a panic reaction to an emergency or to a wheel dropping off the pavement, especially at freeway speeds, the driver can lose control, resulting in the van sliding sideways and rolling over. Rollovers are dangerous incidents and have a higher fatality rate than other kinds of crashes. Of the nearly 11 million passenger car, SUV, pickup and van crashes in 2002, only 3% involved a rollover. However, rollovers accounted for nearly 33% of all deaths from passenger vehicle crashes. In 2002 alone, more than 10,000 people died in rollover crashes."

The reason why we are devoting so much of this month's newsletter to van safety is that we are sincerely concerned about your safety and the safety of all drivers on the road. Remember as a K&K driver you:

- 7) Will operate the vehicle in accordance with all applicable laws, ordinances, rules and regulations.
- (8) Will be solely responsible for any violation, fee or any other cost related to a violation resulting from the use or operation of the vehicle.

Because of the rate of calls we are receiving concerning risky driving behaviors we know it may only be a matter of time before one of our vans is involved in a major incident. As you begin your day of driving please keep in mind the lives of the other passengers on the van, their families, their jobs, and every aspect of their lives that will be impacted if your van is involved in a major incident. Please arrive to your vans on time each morning and evening so you stay on schedule and are not tempted to speed to makeup time. If you feel another driver is not driving responsibly bring it to their attention, speak with your coordinator, or contact a member of the K&K staff. We would like to encourage each van to openly discuss this article and commit to practicing safe driving behaviors. In the end everyone wants the same thing; to arrive to work and back home safely.
