Vanpool Etiquette

The success of any vanpool largely depends on the types of common rules, respect, camaraderie, and etiquette of each van. Just like individual people each vanpool has it's on unique atmosphere. While this is great it is equally important to make sure you are following some common sense etiquette in your vans. This will ensure that everyone has a pleasant commuting experience. Typically we do not dictate the specifics of vanpool etiquette. We leave that up to each individual van. However below are some universal rules that we strongly suggest. These include:



- Always be on time. If you are late ensure you contact the van coordinator or another designated person on your van. Also, have a back-up plan if the van is unable to wait for you. Remember if you are late or not where you should be the van is not required to wait for you or turn back around and pick you up.
- 2. Decide as a group if the radio will be played and if so what stations are acceptable and not offensive.
- Make sure new riders are aware of your individual van's atmosphere and rules. Do not assume they know.
- 4. Be mindful of wearing strong perfumes and body sprays.

- Openly discuss cell phone use in your van. Be mindful of the volume you are speaking if you decide to use your phone. Remember some people use commuting time to rest or catch up on work.
- 6. If you are driving do not speed or drive aggressively. Remember you are endangering your life as well as everyone else on the road.
- 7. Discuss as a van if eating will be allowed.
- 8. Keep your surroundings neat and clean.
- Stay on agreed upon route and follow scheduled pick-up/drop off times unless a special circumstance is agreed upon by all members.
- 10. Simply follow the golden rule and use common sense.

K&K Safety Corner

In 2007 we put out an email that had suggestions for safe driving. Recently we have received phone calls from motorist complaining about unsafe driving behaviors from our vans. Please take note of this article and remember to always keep safety as your number one priority.

Excerpt from email:

- "Suggestions for Drivers:
- 1. Please don't forget to wear a headset to make or answer cell phone calls while driving.
- 2. Please keep in mind the safety, comfort and convenience of your fellow riders while driving the van. Aggressive driving is strictly prohibited. One of the advantages in sitting high while driving the van is your ability to see the traffic better. Plan your braking and speeding accordingly, in order to avoid a rough ride. Please maintain enough distance from the vehicle in front of you. Use lane change indicators when changing lanes.

Here are a few suggestions for safe driving:
1. Don't switch lanes constantly. It causes discomfort to the riders and increases the risk for an accident. It doesn't save a whole lot of time. If you have to change the lane, always use the lane change indicator.

2. Avoid reckless speeding. Vans are difficult to control at high speeds. Driving a van is quite different from driving your car, because of its sheer size and weight. With a weight of approx.6000 pounds(van + passenger weight) going at a speed of 75 MPH results in a significant momentum, that is hard to bring to a quick, complete stop, without making the riders feel uncomfortable.

- 3. Avoid sudden braking. This causes cars behind you to not be able to stop in time and may bump into the van, as the van blocks their view and they can't see the traffic slowing down. It also makes the riders feel really sick.
- 4. Please make the riders feel safe and comfortable. So, please allow for extra time and distance. Stick to your lane. If you are in the left lane, don't leave too much of gap in front of you to prevent the cars behind you from tail gating and flashing their lights. If you are going relatively slow in the left lane, change into the middle or right lanes and let the traffic in the left lane goes ahead. "
