

February 2007 Bridge Officer's Briefing

Members of the Kalamazoo Sail & Power Squadron, you have honored me by giving me the privilege to serve as your fifty-fourth commander. I pledge to you that under my watch, we shall lay the foundation for our squadron's 60th anniversary, which occurs next year. In British parlance, a Diamond Jubilee is a celebration held to mark a 60th anniversary; therefore, I shall refer to 2008 as our Diamond Jubilee Year.

As we progress to our Diamond Jubilee Year, there are several initiatives and goals that I believe will strengthen our squadron. First, I am happy to inform you that I have worked with the P/C Nils Strand, AP and the Finance Committee to establish the "Diamond Task Force." The purpose of the Diamond Task Force is to facilitate our squadron's future viability and provide leadership development for our squadron's future commanders.

Our future commanders and officers will come from our current and future members. Our membership has averaged 100 members for the last few years with approximately 30 percent of members taking leadership roles in our squadron. Accordingly, an important goal of our squadron is to increase membership and membership involvement. I have asked P/C Karen Strand, AP and P/C Robyn Levene, AP to initiate a Membership Drive that will coincide with Spring 2007 Boat Smart courses. I have also asked Robyn to enhance Seamanship, the traditional first course taken by new members to include Operations Training so new members will learn how they can contribute to the future of the USPS and the KSPS; therefore, Robyn will work very closely with 1st/Lt Phyllis Buskirk, P. Additionally, before June 2007, Robyn will offer a Leadership Development course aimed at members and their families: the goal is to introduce members' children and grandchil-

Paddle wheeling down the Tenn-Tom

Editor's note: This is part one of a four part article by KSPS member, Raymond Shoemaker, sharing his experience with Captain Rick Pohn, as they piloted a split wheel paddle wheel down the Tennessee-Tombigbee or Tenn-Tom Waterway. The waterway starts at Yellow Creek (corner of Mississippi Tennes-see and Alabama) and ends at Demopolis AL. Ten days and 455 miles later Ray's journey ended at Fairhope/Mobile AL.

As I told some of you last spring, I was going to take a paddle wheeler from the Lee Spry Boat yard, just south of Yellow Creek TN. down the Ten-Tom waterway to Fairhope (Mobile) AL. The



boat name is Barbara Ann. It is a split wheel paddle wheeler. It is a very neat boat, and will be a great liveaboard when some rewires the 110V system. The engine is a caterpillar diesel. It drives two hydraulic pumps, one for each paddle. There is



also an Onan 15KW generator to power the boat when at sea.

On Thursday, April 27th, at about 5:30 AM we left the boat yard (mile marker 447 on the Tombigbee waterway). It was still dark and after the first mile, we encountered dense fog. Using the radar, we slowly continued past a tow that was sitting alongside the channel. It took about an hour to get through the fog.

At about 11 AM we started to enter Bay Springs Lake (mile marker 420). We heard a growl from the port gearbox. Using the cell phone, we called the boat yard and ask them to meet us at Bay Springs Marina. It was about a half hour drive for the mechanics, while it took us another 45 minutes to get there

several advantages to this change. First, new bridges would have an easier transition since their watches will begin in late spring or early summer. Furthermore, this change would have our squadron's year runs more closely with the USPS educational year. I have asked the Planning Committee to report its findings and recommendation to the membership at the February 2007 Business Meeting.

Robyn is truly a legacy that took our squadron "Back to the Future."

I am certain the 2007 Bridge will keep moving to a bright future because of their experience, their perspectives and interests. After taking the gearbox off and looking inside, we determined that the pinion gears and the planetary gears were striped. The owner was called and advised of the problem. He asked if it was possible to continue on until he could get new gears or a new gearbox.

Knowing that we would be

slowed down from our fast pace of 5 MPH, we said yes. The gear-box was taken off the shaft and the hydraulic pump was lashed to the deck, thus making the port wheel freewheeling.

With this done we left Bay Springs Marina and headed for Whitten lock (mile marker 412). The first of 13 locks we would

have to go through. We called the lock and received the green light for immediate entry.

We continued on with the one paddle pushing us (at 4.5 to 5.0 MPH), and at the Montgomery lock (mile marker 407) we were



again given the green light for immediate entry. Continuing on to about mile 400, we anchored about 100 yards off the entrance to Murphee's marina. The boat's owner requested that we anchor out every night. Up to this point the depth finder was working fine. However the next morning, it quit working. As of this time, we still do not know what happened to it. The adventure continues in the next *Pilot*.




The Headliners will be out in force for the D/9 Spring Conference to be held in Lansing, MI.


What opportunities await you?
